DISCHARGE PERMIT
STORMWATER RUNOFF TO WATERS OF THE STATE

In compliance with provisions of 10 V.S.A. 1263 and 1264:

Town of Shelburne
PO Box 88
Shelburne, VT 05482

and in accordance with "Terms and Conditions" hereinafter specified, the above named permittee is hereby granted permission to discharge treated and controlled stormwater runoff from the impervious surfaces (roads, buildings, drives, etc) associated with the "Maeck Farm Subdivision", Bishop Road, Shelburne, VT to Munroe Brook.

1. **Expiration Date: September 30, 2006.**

Note: Notwithstanding subsequent changes in the Vermont Water Quality Standards or the Agency of Natural Resources Stormwater Management Procedures (effective December 15, 1997) and provided the permittees comply with the terms and conditions of this permit, the permittees shall not be required to make additional changes to the referenced stormwater treatment and control systems during the term of this permit with the exception of stormwater discharges that the Secretary determines to cause or contribute to violations of the Vermont Water Quality Standards. Any changed standard or procedure shall be applied in determining whether or not to renew this permit pursuant to 10 V.S.A. 1263.

Re-apply for a discharge permit by March 31, 2006.

2. **Revocation:** 10 V.S.A. 1267 provides as follows:

"The Secretary may revoke any permit issued by him pursuant to this subchapter if he finds that the permit holder submitted false or inaccurate information in his application or has violated any requirement, restriction, or condition of the permit issued. Revocation shall be effective upon actual notice thereof to the permit holder."

3. **Operating Fees:** This discharge is subject to operating fees. The permittees shall submit the operating fees in accordance with procedures provided by the Secretary.

4. **Transfer of Permit:** This permit is not transferable without prior written approval of the Secretary. The permittees shall notify the Secretary immediately, in writing, of any sale, lease, or other transfer of ownership of the property from which the discharge originates. The permittees shall provide a copy of this permit to the new owner or tenant and shall also inform the new owner or tenant of his responsibility to make application for a permit which shall be issued in his name. Any failure to do so shall be considered a violation of this permit.

5. **Right of Entry :** The permittees shall allow the Secretary or their authorized representative, upon presentation of credentials, to enter the permittees' premises where the effluent sources authorized by this permit are located and at reasonable times to have access to copy any records required to be kept under the terms and conditions of this permit, and to inspect any treatment device, monitoring equipment, or monitoring method required in this permit, and to sample any discharge of pollutants.

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6. Receiving Waters: Munroe Brook
7. Manner of Discharge:
S/N 001: Stormwater runoff from impervious surfaces (buildings, parking, drives, etc) of the Maeck Farm subdivision collected in roadside vegetated swales, discharging via a culvert under Bishop Road equipped with restrictor plate to control flow to a swale which then conveys the runoff to Munroe Brook.
8. Wastes Permitted:
S/N 001: Stormwater runoff from impervious surfaces (buildings, parking, drives, etc) associated with the Maeck Farm subdivision after treatment via flow through vegetated swales and control via a restricted culvert.
9. Volumes Permitted and Frequency of Discharge: Such volumes and frequency as required by the discharges specified in No. 7 above
10. Approved Project Design: Treatment as specified in No. 8 above. For details on the stormwater treatment and control see the Phelps Engineering, Inc. plan sheets specified below and supporting information:
Sheet 1 of 1 dated 3/15/2000 last revised 7/13/00

and the
Civil Engineering Associates Plan Sheets
Sheet 3 dated March 1988 last revised 8/8/88
Sheet 15 dated June 1988 last revised 8/8/88

By reference the above noted plans are made a part of this permit.
11. Compliance Schedule
 - a. **By December 1, 2001, all improvements to the stormwater management system, as referenced in the Phelps Engineering, Inc. Sheet 1 of 1 dated 3/15/200 last revised 7/13/00 shall be completed.**
 - b. **Written notification to the Agency shall be submitted within 30 days of completion of the improvements.**
12. Maintenance and Maintenance Reporting Requirements:
 - a. All stormwater management devices shall be maintained in good operating order at all times and shall be inspected at least **biannually**.
 - b. The collection system and swales shall be cleaned as necessary to maintain design specifications.
 - c. Any sediment removed from the swales shall be disposed of in accord with state and federal regulations.
 - d. **By SEPTEMBER 30 OF EACH YEAR** a written report shall be submitted to the Department of Environmental Conservation, Attn Stormwater Management Section, 103 South Main Street, Waterbury, VT 05671-0405. This report shall include, as a minimum:
 - i. the dates and details of any cleaning and maintenance operations carried out in the preceding year.

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- ii. a narrative summarizing the results of the inspections conducted in the preceding year.
 - e. If these discharges, or the conveyance of stormwater within the stormwater treatment and control system results in or significantly contributes to erosion, then the permittees shall immediately correct any such problems.
 - f. Any stormwater devices used during construction for erosion control shall be inspected and cleaned to design specifications immediately after construction has been completed.
13. Personnel and Training Requirements: Such personnel and training as necessary to fulfill the requirements of #11 above.
14. Monitoring and reporting Requirement: No monitoring required; reporting requirement as specified in #11 above.
15. Other Requirements:
- a. Treated and controlled stormwater runoff from the impervious surface associated with the Maeck Farm subdivision is the only waste authorized for disposal under the terms and conditions of this permit. The discharge for any hazardous materials or hazardous waste into the stormwater management system is prohibited.
 - b. The issuance of this permit does not relieve the permittees from obtaining coverage under General Permit 3-9001, if applicable.
16. Adverse Impact:
 These discharges shall not cause or contribute to conditions that would have an undue adverse effect on the composition of the aquatic biota, the physical or chemical nature of the substrate, species composition, or the propagation of fishes. If information is obtained during the term of this permit which indicates that the discharges authorized by this permit cause or contribute to violations of the Water Quality Standards, then this permit may be amended to require implementation of additional stormwater treatment and control measures.
